Dear mums, dads & carers,

So we've reached the end of another year - and what a year it's been! Who would have thought 12 months ago that I would be writing after another year marred by disruption, hardship & loss.

We've had periods of full lockdown, times when some children were in school while others isolated at home. We've had times when class teachers were in school, teaching remotely to children at home & times when the children were in school being taught by teachers who were at home.

We've had to manage 700 children coming in and out through 5 different entrances at different times of the day - complete with temperature-checks & hand sanitiser & we've made sure that children in different classes didn't mix, in corridors, on staircases or outside.

Children have eaten lunch in their classrooms, attended assemblies via zoom & played only with children from their own class. And not once have they complained or made it difficult; they have just got on & done it. Your children - in case you hadn't realised - are quite amazing.

Whatever the obstacles thrown in our path this year, together we have found a way through; staff, parents & children. This is what Stebon is all about - being there for one another & always finding a way through; recognising that we really are better together. I have never felt prouder to be Stebon's headteacher.

In amongst the hardship - and perhaps even because of it - some incredible things have happened. Children's learning from home was fantastic, powered by the fact that they all had chromebooks to access the teaching (as far as I know, we are still unique in this regard) & the training to use them well. But we - and they - couldn't have done it without the committed support offered by you, their parents. I bet you've learned a thing or two about using computers that you didn't know before! I know I have.

The return to school was brilliant too. Children were so excited to be back in the classroom with their friends and their teachers and they have conducted themselves impeccably. Their progress has been very strong & they are well placed to learn even more next year.

I want to send my heartfelt thanks to our amazing staff team - I am blown away every day by their commitment to your children, by their energy & their creativity & by the togetherness they have shown whenever the job has been hard.

My thanks, as always to you, our parents - you are our most important allies & easily the most significant people in your children's lives. Our job is impossible without you. We are grateful for the opportunity to work with your children - they make us happy every day & keep us young.

My biggest thanks are, as ever though, reserved for your children. They have worked incredibly hard & shown courage & resilience beyond their tender years. You should be very proud of them.

We'll be writing soon with details of the return to school next term as there will be a few changes you'll need to be aware of. Now, though, it's time for us all to take a well-earned rest so that we come back in September with our batteries fully charged and ready for our next round of challenges.

Look after yourselves & one another & make sure to come back smiling in the autumn term.
