Message from Jeremy (Headteacher) regarding gate time changes

Dear mums, dads & carers

I wanted to write, firstly, to say a huge thank you for all your support since we reopened for start of the new school year in September. Despite all of the careful planning & preparation, none of us really quite knew how well the term would begin.

Getting 660 pupils safely in & out through 5 entrances, completely redesigning timetables including outside time, keeping classes separate from one another throughout the day, eating lunch in classrooms, organising extra daily cleaning & having to hold daily staff briefings in the playground – it all seemed rather daunting.

Yet, with this amazing staff team, your understanding & support & the good will & flexibility of your wonderful children, it has run more smoothly than we could ever have imagined.

We have been able to keep the whole school open for the whole half term, attendance has been high & punctuality has been amazing.

As you know, we have been tweaking the way we get children into school in the mornings to make it better for parents & children. It is now quicker & more efficient than it was at the beginning of September; we have tended to open our gates a little before 9am for parents that need to get away quickly & the children have become very good at getting their temperature taken, hand sanitiser applied & getting to their classrooms quickly & without fuss.

All this means that many children are in their classes by 9am, ready to learn every morning & the vast majority of children are in by 9:10. The few children who arrive after 9:15 are missing out on key learning time – up to an hour over the course of a week.

It is for this reason that, **after the half term holiday**, we will be **shortening the length of time that the gates are open in the morning**. They will still be **open at 9am** (or shortly before) & will now **close at 9:15**. For the gates that have more than one year group, both will come in at the same time, one on each side of the entrance.

All latecomers will need to come through the main visitor entrance; ideally we would like there to be no latecomers at all.

These timings will apply to all gates, including the nursery.

There will be no changes to the gate arrangements for the end of the day pick-up.

Thank you for your continued support; we really could not do our jobs without it.
