Entrances and Exits

Nursery enter & exit via the nursery gate between 9:00-9:15 & 3:00-3:15 respectively

Reception pupils enter & exit via the fire engine entrance between 9:00-9:15 & 3:00-3:15 respectively

Year 1 enter & exit via pupil entrance between 9:00-9:15 & 3:00-3:15 respectively

Year 2 enter & exit via main entrance between 9:00-9:15 & 3:00-3:15 respectively

Year 3 enter & exit via the fire engine entrance between 9:00-9:15 & 3:15-3:30 respectively

Year 4 enter & exit via car park entrance between 9:00-9:15 & 3:15-3:30 respectively

Year 5 enter & exit via pupil entrance between 9:00-9:15 & 3:15-3:30 respectively

Year 6 enter & exit via main entrance between 9:00-9:30 & 3:15-3:30 respectively

(For the gates that have more than one year group, both will come in at the same time, one on each side of the entrance.)
