
I came to this country as a ten-year-old who did not speak a single word of English but because of the passion of my teachers and the commitments of my school, I

The event is taking place between the 21st November - 6th December.


Any young person living or going to school within the borough can enter to represent Tower Hamlets.

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
Saturday School

In the meantime, we'll share some ideas of activities you could do on Saturdays to keep you busy.



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Entrances and Exits

Please ensure your children are through the allocated gate in time

Nursery enter & exit via the nursery gate between 9:00-9:15 & 3:00-3:15 respectively

Reception pupils enter & exit via the fire engine entrance between 9:00-9:15 & 3:00-3:15 respectively

Year 1 enter & exit via pupil entrance between 9:00—9:15 & 3:00-3:15 respectively

Year 2 enter & exit via main entrance between 9:00—9:15 & 3:00-3:15 respectively

Year 3 enter & exit via the fire engine entrance between 9:00-9:15 & 3:15-3:30 respectively

Year 4 enter & exit via car park entrance between 9:00-9:15 & 3:15-3:30 respectively

Year 5 enter & exit via pupil entrance between 9:00–9:15 & 3:15—3:30 respectively

Year 6 enter & exit via main entrance between 9:00—9:30 & 3:15-3:30 respectively

(For the gates that have more than one year group, both will come in at the same time, one on each side of the entrance.)
