Unsure what the children are learning now but knew what they were learning at home during lockdown – better communication	Communication did feel robust during lockdown, didn't it. We'll review our termly curriculum booklets & discuss how we share this information better	
Sending curriculum maps home so you could help children	The curriculum section on our website is something I'm particularly proud of. It details what each class does when during the year. There's also a link to the curriculum map. The curriculum team are currently working on knowledge organisers for each subject next year too. We'll share these with you as soon as they're ready	Explore the <u>curriculum</u> section of the website
Unsure who the adults in the classroom are this year	We've been lucky to have more than 20 young people helping out in classrooms this year as part of the Kickstart scheme - we'll make sure to let you know who they are if they're in your child's class	Ask your child's class teacher at the end of the day
Videos to help parents understand what their children are learning and how to help them	Excellent idea. We did well at this during lockdown - it's good to learn from the success of those lessons	Let us know how well we're doing

Communication about end of KS2 tests, discussing individual targets for the children	This is really important. In the summer term, Olly will meet with parents of children currently in year 5 about specific targets for the following year, how parents can support their children over the summer holiday and what progress towards SATs will look like.	Keep talking to your children about their targets. This really helps
More trips and for parents to attend the trips too	This year, trips are starting up again in earnest & they're going really well. The children love them & they get so much learning from them. Wherever we can, we will encourage parents to come	You may need to cover your own travel costs for some trips & there may be some trips that parents are not able to come on. Residentials, for example, give pupils the opportunity to spend time away from parents!

Better communicate the purpose behind the 'Friday' afternoon lesson (Explorers)	Our new website should be launched in May. There will be a page dedicated to Explorers. I think we're breaking important new ground with our Explorers curriculum - it's brilliant. You may well have found out more about it by now, including from your children	Check out the new website
Spelling and high frequency words Focusing on all children and not just the children who have fallen behind during Covid.	Leaders & teachers are accountable for the learning & achievement of ALL children. It's a job we take extremely seriously. However, if some children have fallen further behind than others, it is right that we give them the help they need	Parents are our greatest learning allies. Please help us to help your child by practising reading with them, including high frequency words & spellings
Homework general and for children in year 5 and year 6 to help transition for secondary school	Homework is always a bit of a hot potato. Some parents want more, others less. The research around homework in primary school is not especially conclusive. Our new family learning policy is outlined on the website - complete with embarrassing video!	The most important thing you can do to support your child's learning is to talk to them about what they are learning in school; what they find difficult and what they enjoy

The way that we teach (pedagogy)

What is happening with the teaching of Spanish?	We have a new Spanish scheme of work - it is being taught by all teachers across KS2. Rozy is the modern foreign languages lead	Ask your child to teach you some Spanish!
Tasks to be set and tailored on Mathletics	Teachers know how to set tasks and do so when it's appropriate. We will support teachers in making sure this is consistently applied	Support your child with Mathletics at home whenever they need it
Building behaviours such as confidence	Behaviours & attitudes such as these are so important, not just for school but for life. Our Explorers curriculum is aimed specifically at building behaviours such as teamwork, fairness, kindness & citizenship. Behaviours are also built into and focused on during our themed weeks	Talk with your children about Explorers & how important it is to grow these behaviours in themselves
Y1 reading journal was never communicated on how to use it	I'm sorry to hear this. It's vital that all parents, particularly those of our younger pupils, understand this so that you can support us by supporting your children's reading at home. We need to make sure everyone gets it	If you're still not clear, talk to your child's class teacher
No P.E in reception – (does do indoors/outdoors but wants to change into P.E kit)	We have started PE in reception this term. Children are practising using the areas and equipment they will use in KS1 such as ball skills, the balancing equipment and bikes	Please make sure your child has the correct PE uniform
Parents would like to know more about how EYFS works in Stebon	It's really important that parents new to our school really understand how we operate and the kind of school we are. We will make sure that there are plenty of opportunities for you to get involved	There's also plenty of information on our <u>website</u>

What you said was going well

- Children love school and love getting certificates for attendance
- Good videos preparing children to come back to school
- 'No job too small' staff at Stebon
- Chromebooks made such a difference
- Staff are always approachable, helpful and welcoming

Your ideas for improvement	What we'll do about it	What you need to do
Last minute communication and notice such as, meetings, swimming and holiday clubs	Our aim is that parents are informed of events, meetings & changes to any of the above with as much notice as possible. We will usually communicate by email; there may be occasions where we need to send a text - this will be rare. Our new office manager, Aysha, is dynamite with communication	Keep the feedback coming so we know how well we're doing Check your emails regularly
Appointments that are counted towards attendance is not fair e.g. Covid	It's great to know that attendance is so important to parents. We don't have a choice about the codes we use for attendance registers - they are statutory. What counts as an absence & what doesn't is not decided by schools	It sounds obvious but keep doing what you can to make sure your children are healthy & happy & come to school every day
Reinstating coffee mornings. (Weekly) – Great opportunity to engage with parents	Happy to say these are up & running again. I know they are very popular with the parents that come.	Why not drop in? Especially if you've never been before
More after optional school club activities related to curriculum (e.g. Reading Club, Maths Club etcan opportunity for children who wish to improve attainment)	We will look for opportunities to do provide more of these in 2022-23	Any suggestions are welcome
Parents feel there is some gap in quality of teaching between established members of teaching staff and new hires, and also new hires' engagement with parents and children	I think this is a misconception & not entirely fair. Teachers newer to our school are more likely to have begun their teaching careers during lockdown & so won't have had the opportunity to build those face to face relationships with parents that are so important. They have also had to get to grips with remote learning at the same time. In many cases, it is these new teachers who have been the driving force behind teaching with technology. We will prioritise opportunities for all staff to forge & maintain these relationships with parents	Keep talking to us, let us know when things are going well too
