With the help of Gika our premises manager, Eco-Protector Mugeerah in Y5 was able to record the meter readings from our Switch it Off Day and compare them to the meter readings from an ordinary day at Stebon. From this we calculated the difference in energy consumption over the two days and saw what a saving we made. On Switch it Off day we saved 72 kilowatts of power!



This means a monetary saving of £24.56 for a day and over the school year this is a whopping £4,912.32p! This could buy the school 44,657 pencils, 614 footballs and send 701 children to London Zoo. Not only is this great for school funds, it is much kinder to the environment too. Less energy used, equals less fossil fuels burnt and less harmful gases entering the earth's atmosphere.
