





Stebon primary school offers government funded early education and childcare places for 2-year-olds, privately funded places are also available

Thousands of children across Tower Hamlets have a right to funded early education from the age of two.

If you receive qualifying benefits, your 2year-old can access up to 570 hours of funded early education and childcare a year. This is usually taken as 15 hours a week over 38 weeks, from the claim period following their second birthday.



If your child is not eligible for a Government funded place, we can also offer 30 hour or 15 hours a week places which families can pay for.

Two year olds at Stebon have their own classroom, a high ratio of adults trained in early years to children and access to their own outdoor play space.

The children are happy and settled and get off to a flying start.
