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
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
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




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The wings of death!

Why we want you

In a time of rising prices and failing support systems, we believe that children and families deserve more. We want to talk to you about your experience of raising children and talk about what could work better.

If you are a parent on a low income, on Universal Credit or Child Tax Credits, we want to hear from you* (further detail under Parent Criteria). We want your help to you shape future policies made that affect you and your children. Together, we will raise your voices to Labour and Conservatives and all major parties.

This project is focused on building a system that provides children with a sense of security - and together, we will think about what this looks like. What should children and families be guaranteed for a happier and safer childhood?

The Parent Panel

We are creating a group of 12 parents to join the Parent Panel and meet over a 6-month period, from November 2023 – April 2024. You will shape ideas and specific solutions on what it takes to support a family and a create a good childhood in the UK, simply by sharing your opinion.

We're looking to hear your thoughts on topics such as Universal Credit, issues with housing, mental health services for children and adults, and what it's like to grow up in 21st Century Britain. There's no specific skills or knowledge needed, your experiences and passion are enough, and we will provide support and training for activities that you take part in.

What you will be doing

Stage I: Sharing your opinions with Save the Children, November – April.

- Sharing your opinions on housing, universal credit. mental health services for children and adults, and what you think could work better
- Talking about what families are going through your family, and your local community
- Helping us to find solutions to the problems you and your family are experiencing

Stage 2: Report Launch Celebration, opportunity to help promote the result. April. **OPTIONAL**

- Sharing wider on social media and with your networks
- Talking directly to MPs coming with us to Parliament or meeting your MP locally
- Talking to the media about your experience, either anonymously, giving quotes, or in front of camera

Note: we provide training and support to participate in these opportunities.

*Parent Criteria

You will be a parent with a child or children under 18, who:

- Has the desire to bring change in services to better families' lives
- Has children who have been entitled to free school meals
- Has been in receipt of UC or legacy benefits at any point
- Lives in a household with a total income is less than £30,000 per year

There's no specific skills or knowledge needed, your experiences and passion are enough, and we will provide support and training for activities that you take part in.

Diversity and inclusion commitments

In this work, we are committed to prioritising the voices of Black, Asian and minority ethnic communities. Therefore, we would actively encourage those who identify as from those communities to take part in this opportunity.

What we ask of you

Required:

To attend at least four out of six of the monthly panel meetings (online)

Optional:

- To attend all six of the online monthly panel meetings
- To attend additional training sessions
- To attend an in-person event in London
- All sessions will be reimbursed, and expenses for travel will be covered.

What's in it for you

- Opportunities to build up a variety of skills, including public speaking, social media impact, media and campaigning impact
- Reimbursement for your time, and reasonable out-of-pocket expenses, in line with our policies.
- Peer-to-peer support: being part of a group of parents in similar situations from across the country
- Training and support to empower you to demand change, giving you the confidence to use your voice and knowledge to exercise your political power
- We may be able to provide a reference detailing your involvement with Save the Children that could help with future job applications
