






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
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Year 5 Malala Yousafzai class published their suspense story and made their own little books.

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
















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Tafida (Y5 Martin Luther King class) took part in a performance at Marner school last week to celebrate World Down Syndrome Day.


The Learning Advisory Service celebrated with a performance around "End the Stereotypes" at Marner School.


