**This week's whole school attendance was 95%**

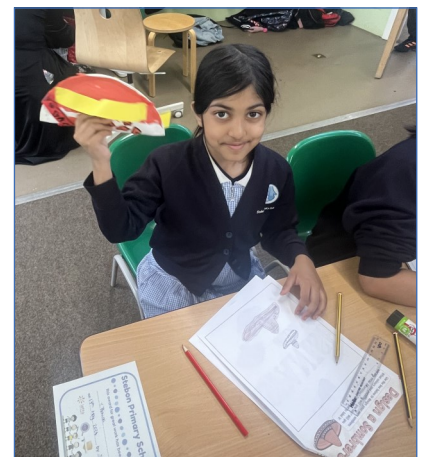

Year 3 Ravi Shankar class had lots of fun making maracas today in celebration of Spanish week. We used them to dance along with Spanish music at our Spanish party!







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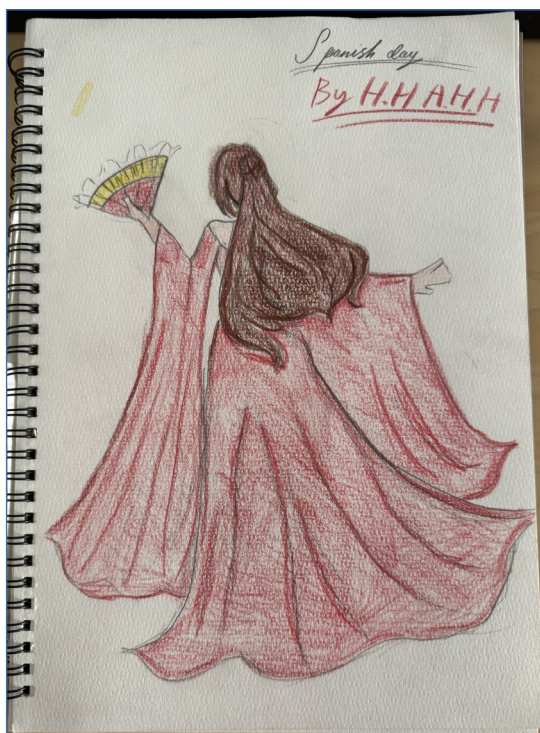
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We had some brilliant Spanish dancing workshops this week delivered by the fantastic Julie. Everyone really enjoyed learning the routines!

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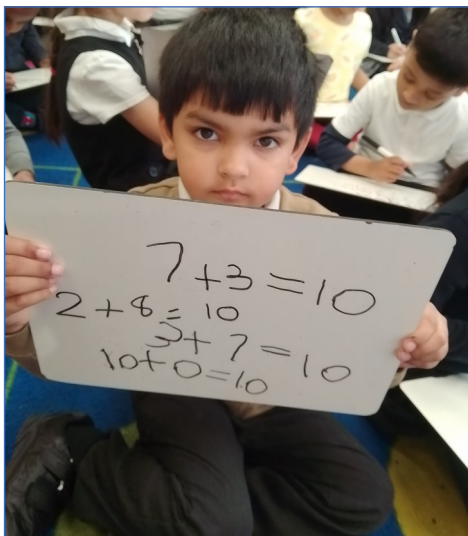
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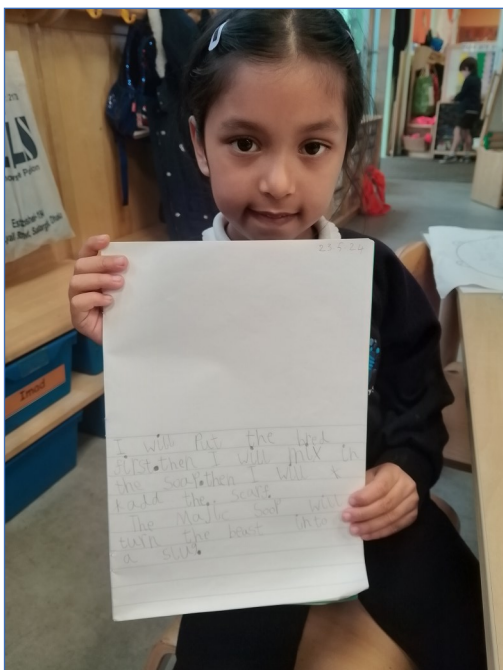
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Saalih (Reception Axel Scheffler class) remembered his number bonds to 10 and wrote them on his whiteboard.

Such love and care on display - even when your arm is in a sling!





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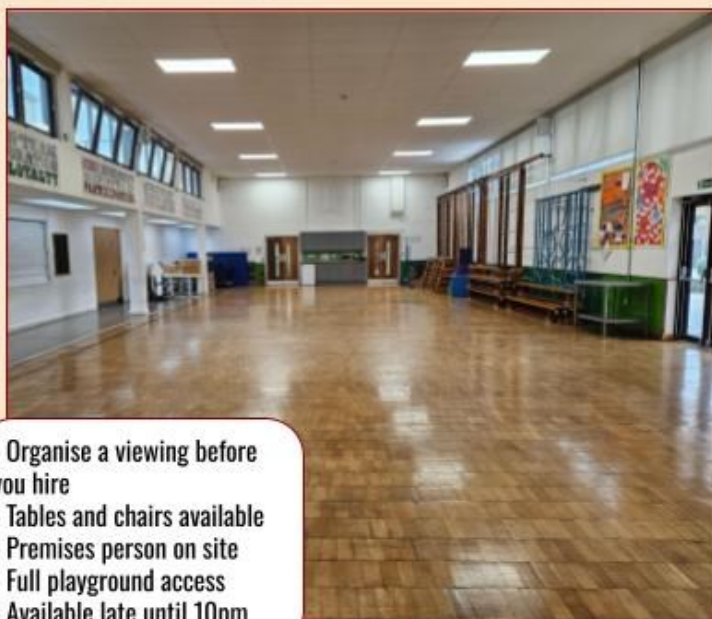
In art club on Friday the children enjoyed the lovely weather and made some chalk mosaics in the playground. They got into teams and created a plan for their designs.

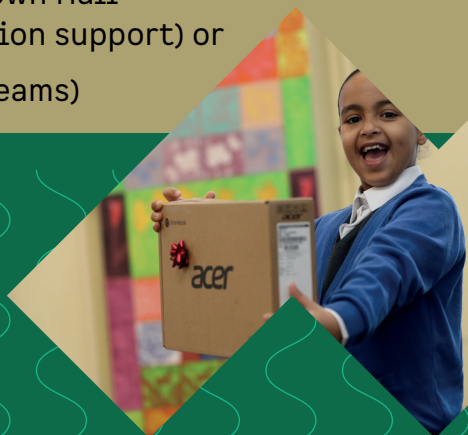
