## EASTERN CHIMPANZEE




## HABITAT

**Appearance**  
Would you be able to single out a blue whale if you saw one? In fact, they are very much alike to most whales. Like most whales they have streamlined bodies, flippers and a horizontal tail to help when migrating. Surprisingly, all blue whales have no ears. Instead they have an internal system of air sinuses and bones to detect sounds.

**Life cycle**  
There are three life stages in a blue whale's life: newborn, adolescent and adult. Uncommonly blue whales stay with their mother until they are ready to travel in search of a mate. Once they reach adulthood they breed every 2-3 years. Blue whales have a lifespan of 80-90 years.

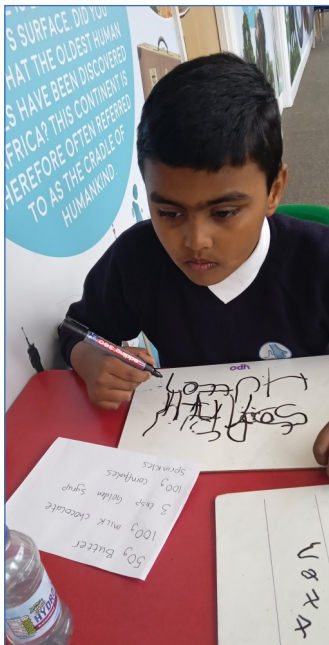
**Fun facts**  
Did you know that blue whales eat 40 million krill per day? Surprisingly they have blood vessels so big you can swim through them.

**Introduction**  
There are many different species of whale, one of the most interesting being the blue whale which has a tongue that weighs about the same as an elephant. Very little information is known about this species because the sea has too much sewage and pollution which kills them. Blue whales have been protected from hunters since 1966.

**Habitat**  
Blue whales are usually very versatile and live in tropical, sub-tropical and temperate seas. However, most of the time they are moving to different biomes in pairs. Ordinarily, they prefer living in clean water with more food to eat. Unfortunately, 50% of the world's waters are polluted with sewage and plastic which means that there is less krill to eat.

The Sea-clownstar

Recently discovered by Melissa Cristina Márquez, who is a marine biologist, the sea-clownstar is instantly recognisable due to its formidable appearance. The solitary-loving sea-clownstar is found in the shallow clean oceans; however, its preferred habitat is the coral reefs due to food sources and shelter to protect itself. This diminutive marine species is classified as a echinoderm, which is a type of invertebrate.

Unique anatomy

As previously mentioned, the sea-clownstar has a truly unique anatomy. It measures up to 5cm (size of a coin). This fascinating creature is made up of three amazing marine animals (head of a clownfish, body of a seastar and tail of a sea horse). When examined closely, its skin contains more than one layer of which protect itself from the

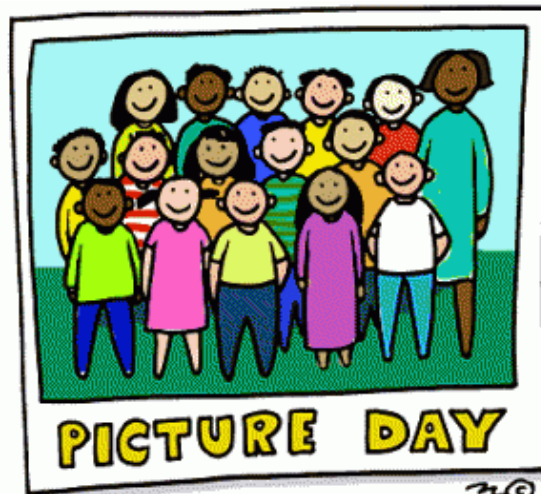
## Class photos

Please ensure your child is in school uniform. Photos will be taken outside in the playground, providing the weather is suitable.

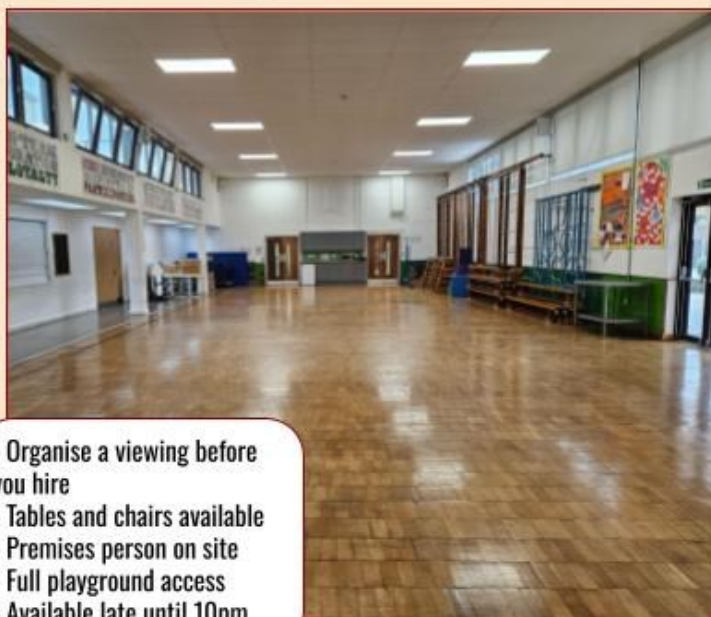
