Reception has been busy this week, it is Be Healthy week and we have been learning about brushing teeth.




We have been learning about changes by painting with our hands, we painted trees through the seasons.



Getting your childcare code for September

If you are an eligible working parent in England, you can apply:

- To get 15 hours childcare per week over 38 weeks of the year from September, your child must be at least 9 months old on or before 31 August.
- For 30 hours childcare per week over 38 weeks of the year, if you have a child aged 3 or 4 years old.

You have until 31 August to get your code from <u>gov.uk</u> to start in September. However, it's important to remember some childcare providers will have different deadlines. Make sure you speak to yours at an early stage to find out more about their arrangements.

If you plan to return to work from parental leave or start a new job by the end of September, you can apply for a childcare code at the same time as everyone else. You will then receive a letter in the post within 1 to 2 weeks.

PENALTY NOTICES

New National Framework for Penalty Notices for poor school attendance and unauthorised leave in term time effective from 19 August 2024.



Per Parent, Per Child Penalty Notices will still be issued to each parent for each absent child.

For example – 2 siblings being absent for unauthorised leave in term time, will result in each parent receiving two separate fines.

First Offence

The first time a penalty notice is issued, the amount will be £160 per parent, per child, if paid within 28 days.

(Reduced to £80 per parent, per child, if paid within 21 days.)

Second Offence

The second time a penalty notice is issued, the amount will be £160 per parent, per child, if paid within 28 days.

(There is no reduction for any early payment.)

Penalty Notices will be issued for:

- Term Time Leave: 5 consecutive days or more
- 10 sessions of unauthorised absence and/or lateness in a 10 week period

Third Offence

The third time a penalty notice is issued, the case will be presented straight to the Magistrates Court.

Fines of up to £2500 per parent, per child, can be issued by the courts.

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WHITECHAPEL TOWN CENTRE PROGRAMME WOMEN'S SAFETY CLASSES

The Whitechapel Town Centre Management Programme was established to support the businesses within the town centre, to ensure they are a part of and benefit from the changes occurring in the area. The programme has a dedicated budget to provide business support and other benefits to employees in the area.





To ascertain how to allocate this budget for the benefit of the local businesses the Council undertook an engagement exercise in 2022 to receive feedback from stakeholders in the area.

Feedback from businesses, employees and other stakeholders helped inform the direction of an action plan for Whitechapel town centre and the priority themes that should be addressed. One of these themes is Women's Safety. We are promoting two projects under this theme.

Firstly, an Education and Promotional Campaign Information which features the Council's Violence Against Women and Girls (VAWG) training courses.

Secondly, Boxfit/Self-defence Classes for all female business owners and employees within the town centre. Classes are free for 18 months starting October 2023.
