I wanted to write to welcome everyone back to the start of a new year and to extend an especially warm welcome to any new children & families joining our school for the first time. You will discover very quickly that Stebon is a wonderful place for your children to learn and grow & for you to feel included and supported.

We want everyone - old and new - to feel a strong sense of belonging; to feel that this is your place and that you are amongst people who care. Together we are key partners in the same goals - that your children love coming to school, that they do well & learn loads and that they grow into good, kind people.

It's been a lovely start to the term so far. I think the children - and the staff! - have really enjoyed their first few days together. I saw so many children skipping through the gates this morning on their way in, often dragging parents behind them!

The beginning of the new school year is a chance to start afresh. It's a good time to talk to your children about how important it is to come to school every day, to arrive on time, to work hard - especially when the work is tough, to never give up and ... most of all, to be kind to one another and to their teachers.

A reminder that the gate opens in the morning at 8:55am and children go directly into classes where they are welcomed by their teachers and peers and they start work straight away. This work is called 'early work' & often involves reinforcing key skills like handwriting, spelling, number bonds, times tables. While the gates technically don't close until 9:10, arriving at that time - especially regularly - means your child misses out on those opportunities. Ideally, we'd like every child to be at their desk learning by 9:00 (or at the sand tray learning, if they're in the early years!)

Your children's teachers are really looking forward to meeting you all properly next week when our parents' welcome meetings begin. At those meetings, you'll get lots of information about the upcoming term & what your child's learning will be - you'll be emailed a copy of your child's curriculum booklet for the autumn term beforehand so you can have a sneak preview. You'll also have the chance to ask teachers any questions you may still have.

Until then, enjoy the weekend. It's good to have you back!


Stebon's magic number is **97** This is because we are aiming for 97% attendance.


School Uniform
