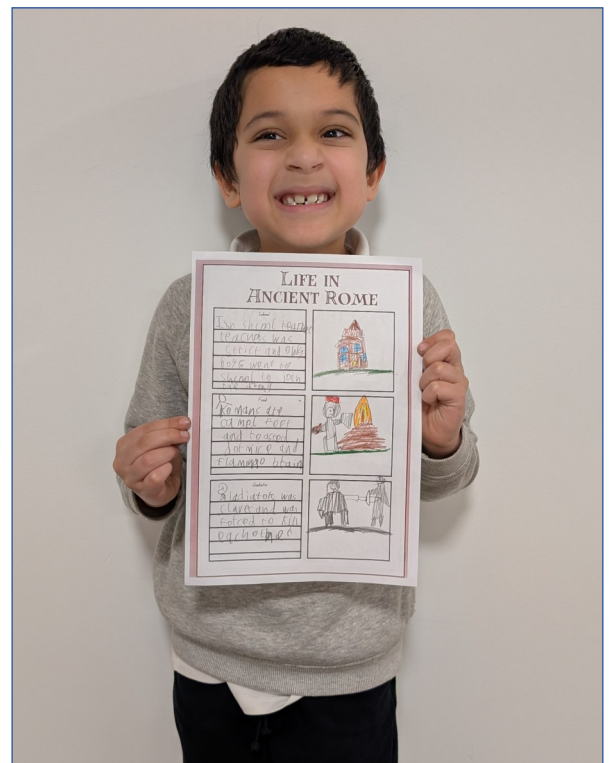

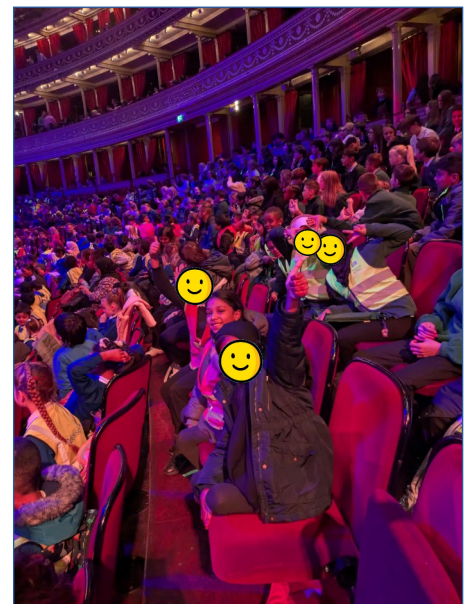
Year 3 have written some wonderful information texts about life in ancient Rome.
