We really want to make sure that we've heard as many voices as possible so that we can make the best possible decisions about our school so we appreciate every response.

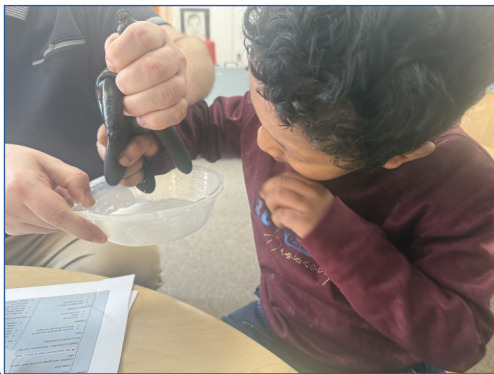
This questionnaire does not replace the 'Shaping Stebon's Future' event for parents in the summer term. It will help us to know which things you'd like to talk about.



Year 1 Jessica Ennis-Hill class have been learning about volume and capacity in maths. The children explored how much different containers can hold by using cups to measure and compare a jug, tray and bowl. They carefully counted how many cups were needed to fill each container and discussed which held more or less.



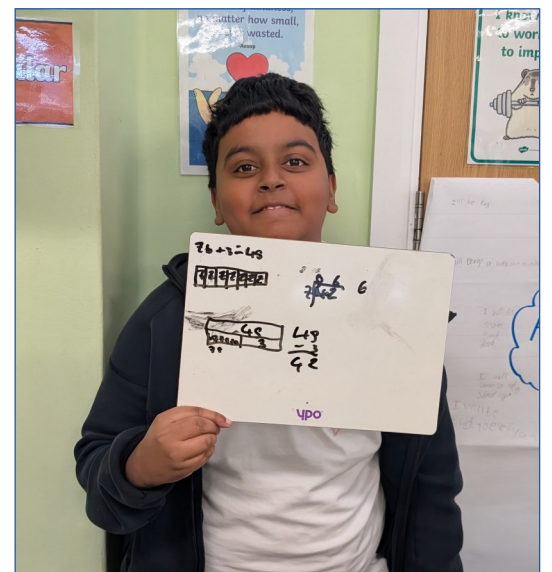
For their English unit on animals, some of the children in Jessica Ennis-Hill class became farmers as part of their learning! They had lots of fun taking part in a sensory activity where they got to "milk" cows. The children loved talking about what they could see and feel.



In music lessons over the past week, children have been learning to play different instruments such as djembe, ukulele, and recorders. They have also been exploring the history of instruments from the Middle Ages and music from the Tudor period. In addition, they were introduced to inspiring composers like Beethoven, along with some background information and examples of his work.

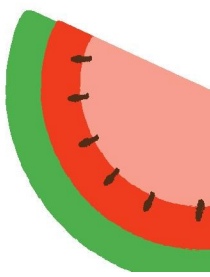
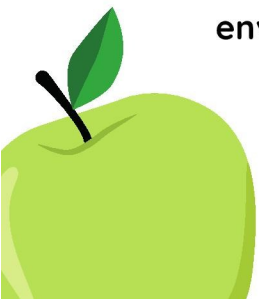
These choices help support healthy habits while ensuring all children can enjoy the celebration.
